




Book Week and World Book Day

She told the children about what inspired her to become an author and she was impressed by the children's thoughtful questions. The children were then able to buy books signed by Abi in the playground. Each class got to visit **Waterstones** to spend their vouchers on the books published for World Book Week.



Each class planned, designed **and wrote their own book!** Examples of these are Year 2's wonderful tale of a magic tennis ball, Year 3's sensational stories about saving the environment, and Year 4's amazing non-fiction information book about the Anglo-Saxons!
